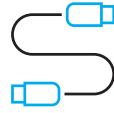


AT&T Investment and Innovation Enhancing Broadband Access in Georgia

Purpose-built [FirstNet](#) cell sites are supporting communities across the state **including Adrian, Arlington, Brixton, Enigma, Fargo, Georgetown, Homerville, Pearson, Ideal, Mauk and Washington**.

High-quality **Band 14 spectrum** added to **more than 1,300 sites** across the state supporting markets **including Atlanta, Haralson, Chattooga, Columbus, Athens and Jasper**.

"FirstNet is a gamechanger for first responders – from voluntary emergency responders in our rural communities to those on the front lines in our more densely populated metro areas," said Homer Bryson, retired Director of the Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security and Vice Chair of the Homeland Security Board.

ADDITIONAL INVESTMENT TO HELP CLOSE THE HOMEWORK GAP

To help bridge the homework gap for our Georgia students, especially amidst COVID, AT&T contributed **\$100,000 to the Georgia Foundation for Public Education, providing Wi-Fi to nearly 450 school buses in 36 school systems in rural parts of Georgia**. The contribution also included two free months of service for each device.

"AT&T is doing our state a great service, helping us take a step forward to address the lack of available broadband connectivity for Georgia students," said Governor Kemp. "This issue has come into sharp focus during the COVID-19 pandemic as so many rural students struggle to continue remote learning without internet access. **We thank AT&T for recognizing that the children affected by this lack of connectivity are the young people who represent our future. Their generosity will leave a lasting legacy.**"
