

Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) & Access from AT&T: Bringing Free High-Speed Internet to Eligible Households

1 Enroll in the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)

What is the ACP?

A federal government program that provides up to a \$30/month benefit on internet service. Eligible households on qualifying Tribal lands can receive up to a \$75/mo. benefit.

Who is eligible for ACP?

Households at or below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines or if they participate in a qualifying federal assistance program, such as SNAP, WIC, Medicaid, Veterans Pension & Survivors Benefit, or if they received a Federal Pell Grant in the current award year, among others.

How do people apply?

Eligible households should visit affordableconnectivity.gov to apply and get approved.

2 Sign up for Access from AT&T

What is Access from AT&T?

A low-cost internet service from AT&T for eligible households.

What's included in the plan?

For \$30/mo.¹:

- Internet speeds up to 100Mbps²
- Unlimited data
- Free installation and in-home Wi-Fi access
- No annual contract, no deposit, no equipment fees

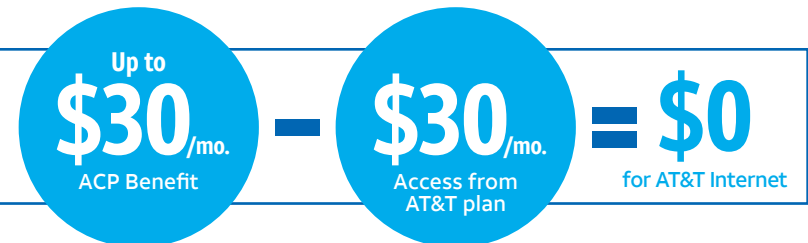
Who is eligible for Access from AT&T?

All households that qualify for ACP and apply the benefit to AT&T Internet service are also eligible for Access from AT&T.³

How do people get Access from AT&T?

- 1 Households should first get approved for ACP.
- 2 They can then call 855.220.5211 to sign up for Access from AT&T.

3 Get FREE internet by using ACP benefits to cover the cost of Access from AT&T⁴
